A Warm Welcome

Open Houses

Before the calendar even turned to September, both campuses hosted Open Houses to welcome families to the 2025-2026 school year. Backpacks filled with school supplies and smiling faces flooded the hallways and spilled into the classrooms. Calendars were handed out, treats were enjoyed, and connections were made with both new and familiar faces. In Smithville, new families wore red nametags and returning families wore blue nametags, encouraging an intentional weaving of community by ensuring new families

were welcomed. In Stoney Creek, families were invited to select a piece of cloth or ribbon and inscribe it with the names of their family members to contribute to a school-wide weaving. Open Houses provide an opportunity for students and their families to be welcomed into the schools by staff and also for the community to be woven together.

First Day of School

September 2nd was the first day of the 2025-2026 school year. It was a joy-filled day, filled with intentionality, meant to include and enfold

each person who walked through the doors of our schools. Bus drivers cheerfully greeted students at the beginning of the day. Families were welcomed at drop-off and invited to chapel. Office staff graciously responded to all the questions and ensured things went smoothly. Teachers purposefully designed activities to ensure all children felt belonging and paraeducators lovingly supported children in a variety of ways.

Opening Chapels

There was a buzz of excitement and expectation as our principals led our school community in our first chapel of the new school year. Each of our campuses began the year with a school-wide chapel, including a time of praise and worship, a devotion reflecting our school theme: Woven Together, and a warm welcome to staff, students and families, especially those who were joining Cairn Christian School for the first time. **These** school-wide gatherings are evidence of a community being woven together, inviting each person into our vision of inspiring a diverse and unified student body to love, learn, and lead with God's grace, bringing Christ's love to the world.





































In the Classroom: **Relationships First**

If you ask any student at Cairn Christian School how they begin and end their day at school, they will respond with "morning meeting" and "closing circle." For many, it's their favourite part of the day. These intentional interactions are **one of the ways** we weave: each student is an integral part of their classroom community and belongs!

What is a morning meeting?

- An intentional practice of beginning the day together as a class
- A time of devotions and prayer
- A time to greet each other by name
- A time to learn about each other: What does each student love? What interests them? What do they get excited about? What are their gifts? How has God worked in their lives and how is He continuing?




What is a closing circle?


- An intentional practice of ending the day together as a class






Student quotes:

In the past five years, we've had to replace and maintain consistently our growing fleet of 15 buses that serve both campuses and the high school as well. As maintenance costs rise, the situation has become unsustainable. More breakdowns and delays are not only frustrating, but they're also putting a strain on the service provided to our families.

Our Plan: New Buses, New Reliability

Through our Driving the Way Forward Campaign, we're working to replace our fleet with new, reliable buses that will:

- Reduce Downtime: Fewer breakdowns and more consistent service.
- Cut Costs Long-Term: New buses mean lower maintenance, which allows us to reinvest in better service.


